

People with Disabilities: A Financial Snapshot



Disability costs the U.S. economy \$260 billion annually. Of this, only 10% is covered by insurance.

People with disabilities are almost 3 times more likely to live in poverty than those without.



Financial Stress Among People with Disabilities



People with disabilities are almost 3 times more likely to experience difficulty paying bills.



The number of people in need of financial counseling has increased 30% since 2010.

Impact of Financial Stress on Long-term Economic Stability and Well-being



People with disabilities are almost 3 times as likely to struggle with late bill-paying.

People with disabilities are more likely to:



miss rent payments

10% of people with disabilities miss rent payments, compared to 3% of people without disabilities.



visit financial counselors

15% of people with disabilities visit financial counselors, compared to 5% of people without disabilities.



miss bill payments

30% of people with disabilities miss bill payments, compared to 10% of people without disabilities.



People with disabilities are almost 3 times more likely to skip medical treatments because of cost.
