Accessibility Tips

When adding the badge, please be sure to add Alternative Text (alt text) to the image. Alt text is used to provide a description to the viewer for those who are blind, have low vision or use assistive technology like screen readers. Alt text should be a short description that describes both the content and function of the image. For example, alt text for the Equity Ally badge could read: "[Organization name] is an NDI Equity Ally, championing diversity, equity, inclusion and accessibility for people with disabilities."

When captioning the badge on social media or within descriptive text like blogs and newsletters, you are welcome to use the suggested language:
